

Rebuilding Together Pittsburgh Program: Affordable Housing Repair

Leveraging construction know-how to provide high-quality repairs

Each of the country's 12 Federal Home Loan Bank (FHLB) regional banks, by law, must establish an Affordable Housing Program and contribute 10% of its earnings to it. Low-income homeowners in Allegheny County benefit from this mandate through the work Rebuilding Together Pittsburgh performs in partnership with its local bank partners such as First Commonwealth Bank, First National Bank, and Brentwood Bank.

Accessing funding for quality renovations

The experienced RTP staff is familiar with the strict income, geographic, and special requirements that must be met to convert an owner-occupied property

into a safe and healthy home. Hazelwood is the first neighborhood where RTP used FHLB funding. Other communities include East Liberty, the Hill District, Hilltop, Homewood, and most recently, McKeesport. Annually, RTP uses \$1 to \$2 million in FHLB funds on projects for low-income homeowners.

Smart investment for homeowners and communities

Since 2017, RTP has leveraged FHLB funding to meaningfully improve 133 low-income homes with repairs totaling more than \$7 million.
